## School Council

Our fabulous School Council representatives have done a great job of finding out what our children think of playtimes. We have listened to their thoughts and ideas and are planning a range of improvements for break times. This includes more play equipment, and the use of Play Leaders. We will soon be

asking KS2 children to apply for these very important jobs. During the Easter break, we will be having a new scooter park installed - this will help to keep scooters safe during the day.



#### **Bike Library**

We had a great response to our Bike Library. Many children were able to sign up to borrow a bike for a year, free of charge. The team from 'Revolution' also

managed to carry out safety checks and repairs on some of our children's own bikes.. The Bike library was funded by Northern Power Grid, who also spoke to children in KS1 and KS2 about the dangers of electricity.



#### **Free School Meals**

Since September 2014, all children who are in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 in a state-funded school are offered a free, healthy school lunch. Although they receive a free school meal, this does not automatically qualify them for pupil premium funding. Children will qualify for pupil premium funding, including a free school meal in other year groups, if their parent is in receipt of



eligible benefits. If you feel you may be eligible for free school meals, you can apply via the Hull City Council website and it only takes a couple of minutes: <u>Free school meals | Hull City Council</u>

The cost of a school meal for children in Years 3, 4, 5, and 6 who are not entitled to free school meals is £1.50 a day.
