We would also like to thank you for your continued prayers and thoughts for Mr. Kenningham and his family in this difficult time. The situation appears to be improving and things are much more positive.



Safer Parking

We are aware that there have been some difficulties with traffic outside school at the beginning and at the end of the school day which compromises the safety of both children and adults. Whilst we are limited, as a school, as to what we can enforce, we will do all that



we can to ensure that your children are safe. We have had a very productive meeting with the PSCO, members of the local council and our local councillor and we are investigating different solutions to help address the problem.

In the meantime, we would ask that all car drivers be considerate and park responsibility ensuring that they do not park on the zig-zag yellow lines directly outside school or block pedestrian crossings.

We would also encourage you not to leave your car engine idling and consider effects on both health and the environment. Even better, perhaps you could consider leaving the car at home and walking or cycling if at all possible. We would also welcome any ideas you have that could help to alleviate the problem.
