

St John's Pre-school Nursery Curriculum Outline 2024

Our nurseries intent is to uphold the Christian Ethos of the Bible as we bring <u>LIFE</u> into the local community by:

- Loving God through our care
- Introducing Christian Values
- Fruit of the Spirit Cultivation
- Employing staff who uphold the Christian Ethos

We will implement this by:

Invironment

Providing a happy, safe and stimulating **environment** for every child who attends the Nursery whatever their race, culture, religion, means or ability, ensuring the safety and well-being of our children.

Partnership

Working in partnership with parents/carers to enhance their child's learning experience in the Nursery and at home, matching the diverse nature of the local community in our themes, activities and resources.

Christianity

Introducing **Christian teaching** as part of the curriculum and cultivating values such as honesty, kindness, respect for one another and for property through example and instruction (e.g., plays, stories and activities) and encouraging a culture which seeks to put others first.

unding

Ensuring the use of **funding** for the benefit of the children through enhanced staffing, focused friendship groups and quality resources.

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Following the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) **framework**, specifically the 'Birth to 5 Matters' (Sep 21) guidance which allows us to focus our observations and goals according to each child's individual needs based upon our staff's secure knowledge of child development.

A progressive curriculum which is fuelled by our 'observation, planning and assessment cycle' (attached) that allows us to tailor our weekly activities to the individual children's interest alongside our goals and planning themes.

Using a daily routine (attached) that enhances play and learning in partnership

The impact of our curriculum will be:

Happy children who are secure in their learning (see goals) and able to approach their next steps in life with Christian values enhancing their enriched education.

Daily Routine

8.50am Children arrive.

Parent/carer brings child into cloakroom and sanitise their hands before hanging up coat. Parent to let staff know if someone else will collect child that day. Then both can come into nursery room to swop their child's book from their book-bag and then child finds name card and puts on board to self-register. Parent settles the child into an activity and shares any relevant info with keyworker.

Continuous provision in the areas of the room - creative; sand and water; maths; construction; small world; role play; computer; mark making and quiet/books/listening.

Planned activities in each area according to theme / child initiation.

- 9.10 Onwards → Continuous provision indoors and outdoors.

 Two group times to be carried out according to activities Rota.

 (9:10 9:25 = Group 1, 9:25 9:40 = Group 2, In Cloakroom)
- 9.45 Children encouraged to tidy up and all go outside for free choice play.
- 10.30 Come in and wash hands. Snack time together.
- 10.45 Children hand in snack items.
- 10:50 Continuous provision as above. And then group activities as below for 15 minutes within this section (e.g. 11-11:15 / 11:15 11:30)

Together time Choices (rotated each week)

- Turn Taking Games / Activities
- Singing all together
- Music all together
- Fridays Bible time towards end of session (11:25am)
- 11.30 Children encouraged to help tidy up.
- 11.35 Story time followed by song and goodbye prayer all together.

11.50 Children Leave

Parents enter to gather stuff and child - staff to meet their parents, any info for the day is passed on.

Initial home visit assessments using an 'All About Me' form and assessment of any additional SEN / transition needs.

Collect any previous EYFS assessments for reference.

Transition visits with observation and assessment on additional transitional / nursery requirements.

On entry Obs - Tracking Sheet for baseline, wows, photo portrait
These are then used to get to know the child's best progress methods

In Setting | On Entry

Planning Overviews
Half Termly big theme
(based upon children's interests)
Weekly Theme Planning
(based upon EYFS areas and identified needs)

'All About Me's' and
SEN APDR targets are then used
to make sure parents are kept
aware of progress throughout
the year. Info is discussed
at parents evenings,
'stay and plays' or as needed.
Parents inform staff of any
WOW moments from home and

comment on progress.

Parental Involvement

Half Termly Obs

WOW Moments - daily highlights
that show amazing moments of
progress that the child is making.
These can be linked with photos or
just written. Parents complete
these to add to the overview.

(All recorded on 'obs overview' sheets)

Securing Development
Staff observations indicate the impact of curriculum goals and are recorded onto:

- The Weekly Theme Planning

- All About Me's

- APDR Targets for SEN

The information observed and assessed is then used to inform the Termly EYFS Summary which also then provides specific EYFS targets, strengths and weaknesses.

Friendship Groups
Feed into the observation cycle and provide information on progress.
Children with particular needs can be prioritised within these.
(Pupil Premium focused)
